TEACHING OF THE CHURCH



For many years there were several Church of God people in the Bryant/ Benton area who felt there was a need for a new Church of God in this area. Brother Bert Brown was one of those believers. He had a vision, a dream, but most of all he had a calling to start a church plant in this area.

In August 1991, Bro. Bert Brown and Tony Ellis began meeting to plan for the Bryant Church Planting. These meetings went on for six months. It then seemed the vision had died. The Lord's timing was not right. In the next few years, talk of a new Church of God in the Bryant/Benton area kept surfacing often enough to keep the vision alive. Bro. Brown and Clay Shields began discussions on the church plant in 1996. Again the Lord's time was not now.

Finally on Sunday April 20, 1997, New Song Community Church of God held its first pre-church service. Attendance that day was 13. Over the next few months some 43 different people attended the services at different times. Brother Brown was leading the services and preaching. Kim Brady was leading the song services and Judy Brown was playing the keyboards. On June 8 the church's first baptismal service was held. Brian Brady and Luci Mathus were baptized. Along about this time, Jackie McPherson came onboard and began to work with the children's ministry.

Services at this time were being held in a suite at I-30 West Plaza in Bryant.

In September, the Lord opened the doors and several of those long time believers in this new church plant began attending. On October 5, 1997 we had our first service as an official congregation.

In February 1998 the Lord opened another door for us and we started renting the facilities of The Glory of the Lord Tabernacle on Highway 5, just outside of Bryant.

In March 1999 we moved to Benton and rented suites at a small mall on I-30 by the Congo Road overpass. Bro. Ray Borel came on as Pastor in December 1999. In December 2001 we moved to our present location at 1458 Salem Road in Benton. On March 15, 2009 Bro. Bob Burchfield became Pastor and is still with us today.

The first sermon was in the fall of 1922 in a local sawmill camp. Pastor Elmer Hurst was instrumental in organizing the church and was it's first pastor. Some of the first services were held in a brush arbor. A log church was completed in time for the first service held the First Sunday in 1936. This log church was used for ten years. In 1946 a block and stone church was built and has been added to over the years. Grape Chapel is known as a giving church to the local community, the state and to the national and foreign missions.

This church was started by evangelist George S. Johnson, who arrived in Little Rock with his Bible, Song Book and his tent. This was about 1903, Brother Johnson preached the message of Justification, Sanctification, the healing of the sick and Unity between all God's children. There was not a permanent place of worship so the church moved where they could find space. In the early 1920' it was on W 18th and a 30x50' building was constructed with a dirt floor and wood stove, later a floor and platform was put in. This church also had a small choir. Later 2 rooms and bath were added for living quarters for the pastors family.

Lawrence Brooks was the pastor in 1917 and penned the old hymn *He Lifted me Out*, he was about 22 at the time. F. L. Hurst and L. C. Cash, Harvey Brooks, E F Brown, Morris Driggers, William Livingston, Kenneth Jones were followed by Ivan Alls, Henry Staggs and Daulton Hutson.

In 1938 a musician named A. L. "Soap" Milliken, known for his trumpet and musical ability started attending and formed a choir, he was an accomplished composer, arranger and instrumental in starting the Arkansas Symphony, he served as choir director from 1938 until his death in 1978. His wife Ruth joined him later, his daughter Nancy is now married to Jerry Riddle.

The church relocated to 12th and Thayer and then purchased property on Frenchman's Lane and built the new sanctuary and classrooms with opening service in Feb. 1972. The new location grew and a gymnasium was added under the leadership of Daulton Hutson. The leadership of Jerry Riddle and Tony Ellis also grew the church and later a Christian school was added for several years.

In 2008 with the congregation losing members due to the location and closing of the school, the decision was to sell the church and purchase new land. The current location of Community Park was purchased in December 2008, and the congregation moved to a small building which was remodeled to meet our needs while the new building was planned and constructed. With 13+ acres the ideas of what we could do was challenging. Dustin Sells was our pastor during most of this time until he resigned to return to Oklahoma City.

Finally, after all the construction was completed under the supervision of a church board the church triumphally marched from the small 'churchett' to our new building on October 10, 2010 for our first service in the new building.

Pastor KC Graves and his wife Dianna, also a pastor, have been leading since being called, and our congregation is growing and expanding to meet the challenges of 2020 and beyond.

Our history:

After a series of home meetings, the first of which was held in the home of Wesley Lum, the congregation of the First Church of God met for the first public worship service in the old Harris School House in March of 1949 with 41 present. Brother I. Ray Jackson, pastor at Bastrop, LA church served as temporary pastor, assisted by sister Ruby Robinson. Brother E. F. Brown became the first pastor on November 1st, 1949 and started raising funds for a new church building. After raising \$8,000 and borrowing \$10,000 the Crossett Lumber Company donated a frontage of 385 feet on Main Street and donated \$5,000 for the building fund on September 7th, 1951. The old Crossett Health Center building was then purchased and disassembled, the materials were used in the construction of the new church. Thousands of hours of labor were donated, along with contributions from the Bastrop church and other generous friends to make the completion of the church possible. A thriving, exciting church was begun in a pioneer spirit. Many improvements have been made to the building through the years, a family life center (Hughes Hall) was completed in 1975 to accommodate additional ministries. Childrens Church began in 1975, which lead to starting a bus and puppet ministry. In 1977 a Live Nativity was presented for the first time and continues as our gift to the community. The original building served for over 50 years, but in the early 2000's it became apparent that due to the age and other issues a new building was needed. After much prayer and planning construction was begun in January 2006 and a beautiful new facility was dedicated in November 2006. Over the past several years we have made many improvements and purchased a new piano, paved the parking lot, and upgraded where needed.

Even as we celebrate these past 70 years we look forward to the future and are excited about the opportunities for service and reaching out to others in unity as the family of God.



First Church of God in El Dorado was started by Pastor Ray D. Elders in 1951. The State Ministry made it a State Project to help support this new work. With the support of the State and a loan from The Board of Church Extension in Anderson, IN, this congregation purchased the 900 block of North Mosby Avenue. Pastor Elders, carpenter by trade, did much of the construction work in erecting the first Sanctuary of their own to Worship

Under the leadership of Pastor Dan Harden, a new Sanctuary was completed in 1971,

the older Sanctuary was then used as a Fellowship Hall.

One of the earliest members, was Mary Dean Setliff, who will be 98 this year, led Music and Worship for over 40 years. Although, now living in Northwest Arkansas, she is still a vital part of this congregation as her prayers continue to lift up First Church daily. She is still leading people in her Rehab Facility, to know Jesus Christ as their personal Savior.

We thank the Lord for the leadership of all former Pastors and for the support and

leadership of many strong lay-leaders.

Once again, the Arkansas State Ministry has taken First Church of God in El Dorado as a project with financial help and prayer. This time a project for revitalization. Retired Pastor Bert Brown and his wife Judy were pulled out of the moth balls and accepted the Interim position in November, 2019, until the congregation could be built back up where they could afford the support a permanent pastor.

Although with 2020 and the Covid-19, it has been difficult to do extensive outreach.

But this small group of Believers have bonded together in the Love of Jesus, and believe

in time the Lord will open the doors and that the best is yet to come.

Our History:

The First Church of God in Gurdon began when God planted a seed in the heart of Bro. A. B. (Alvin) Mizell. He had pastored a church in Louisiana and worked for Missouri-Pacific Railroad before transferring with MOP to Gurdon. In the late Forties, Bro. and Sis. Mizell started the church with services being held in their homes. Later a building was built on Main Street in Gurdon. Bro. Mizell rode his bicycle handing out tracts and Gospel Trumpets while inviting people to hear the Gospel. He had an older truck that he built plywood sideboards upon and painted "Children brought up in Sunday School are seldom brought up in court." He put benches in the back and began picking up people for church. He truly had a heart for God's people, the poor, and children (small children to teenagers). The truck was packed each Sunday for services.

The church continued serving God and reaching out to people to spread His Word. Several pastors served the church and services were held twice on Sunday and on Wednesday night. The church enjoyed Revivals, Music Schools, and occasionally Gospel Singings on Sunday afternoon to a packed crowd. Homecoming services were observed the first Sunday in October with a large attendance. The kids and youth had Christmas and Easter plays and programs each year. Christmas Sacks (apple, orange, peppermint stick and bubble gum) were given to everyone. On Easter, the church always had a picnic and egg hunt. In 1962 AP&L purchased the building and land on Main Street, and the church and parsonage were moved to 7190 Highway 67 South. Classrooms and a fellowship hall were added to the church, and a couple of times renovations were done. A new sanctuary was built and dedicated in 1988. A new fellowship hall and classrooms were added soon afterwards.

In 2007 the church voted to change the name to Evergreen Church but still remains a part of the Church of God (Anderson, Indiana). Gurdon is located in the heart of the timber industry, and the church is near the Gurdon Lake so we chose Evergreen Church from Jeremiah 17: 7-8. Through the years, the Children and Youth Ministries on Wednesday nights have been one of the main outreach programs of the church. We first purchased a sixteen-passenger van, filled it to capacity, and then to running over. Later, two extra vans were purchased. Many of these young people do not attend on Sundays but are very faithful on Wednesday nights. Any child or youth is welcome, and we are blessed to be able to plant a seed in their hearts, feed them, and love them.

Another ministry of the Church is the Community Pantry of Gurdon. We partner with the Arkansas Food Bank where monthly supplies of food are purchased to help struggling families in Gurdon. Once a month, we serve around 170 families. Other churches in the area contribute each month along with special donors. Various people from churches and organizations help in the distribution of food. This ministry began in 2012, and since then, the church purchased a large building in downtown Gurdon and began tearing down and remodeling it. Much of the work is complete, but there are a few more projects to finish. The building has a large seating area, kitchen, rooms, and restrooms.





Our story beings in the spring of 1909, where prayer meetings were being conducted in various homes in Paragould, AR. In August 1909 the various members of those homes joined in a group to hold a two-week revival in a tent on the corner of south 5th Street and West Kingshighway. Two ministers, Rev. W. T Seato and Rev. J. H Ball, conducted the revival in which several people were saved and began worshipping together in one accord. In the fall of that year, Rev. J. H. Ball moved to Paragould to assume pastorship of the group (1909-1924). The church used a tent during the summer of 1910 to hold their worship services. In 1911 the lot was purchased on the corner of South 6 1/2 street and West locust, where a one room frame building was built. That was the birth of the First Church of God in Paragould, AR. Since then more pastors have come and gone over the years, we are proud to have had the leadership of so many godly pastors. We are now happy to announce that we have a new pastor, Rev. Steven "Billy" Pearson, he has been a member of this church for several years. Many of the elders watched him grow as a Christian. He is doing a great job, especially during this 2020 (Covid-19) pandemic.

CHURCH HISTORY

First sermon 1922 was preached, congregation established in 1925, the Piggott congregation had its actual beginning as a regular church about the year 1925. Preaching began in the vicinity about 1922, the first actual meeting was held by J R. Tackett, Thomas G. Phillips, Sister McAnally, a Brother Kerrnoele. Brother Tackett held the meeting at the courthouse and later he and Brother Kerrnoele held a meeting in a brush arbor. The work organizing and starting a congregation was done by Rev Thomas E. Phipps about 1925. The first service was held in an old broom shed at the location where the church now stands. The first building, a frame structure, was built in 1926. B. B. Carvens, a charter member of the congregation took the lead in this building project, and with volunteer help and other sources succeeded in erecting the building, which was then led by Reverend J. B. Brunk. A Popular Bluff, Missouri Pastor preached the Dedication sermon. A local minister Sister Ropha Thrasher had much to do with keeping the church moving during these early days. Sister Thrasher also gave much assistance to other struggling congregations in the state and did a lot of preaching in other local communities. The recent church structure was built during the pastorage of Rev. Estelle Triplett, he served as pastor from 1958 to 1962. He carried on a very successful building campaign which resulted in the nice brick building in which they are now worshiping. It was built on the original lots which were donated when the congregation was launched by L. A. and Goldie Braden. The congregation throughout its history, has been loyal to the general work at Anderson and all the pastors have cooperated wonderfully with our state work. In fact, Piggott had been one of our most active congregations in the state. And following the beginning Pastor Phipps, the church has been served by many notable pastors and currently by Gary Laughlin.

CWC scholarship program awarded to students who attend our Church sponsored colleges, , 2019/2020 was to Jessica Duff, 2020/2021 to Koty Boyer. This program is open to any student in our churches and an application is available to apply. More than one student can get help from our scholarship

Nora Siens Hunter, founder and first president of the National Woman's Missionary Society of the Church of God, formerly known as the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society, was started about 1932 after approval from the General Assembly of the Church of God. In 1957 several churches in Arkansas sent women in leadership from their congregations, and some pastors, to the First Church of God in Little Rock for a meeting to consider organizing a state group in Arkansas. After discussion by all an article of incorporation, bylaws and other business articles needed to begin the Women's Missionary Society of Arkansas were approved. Many of the women who used their abilities went back to their congregations and organized the WMS with leadership. After that the spring meeting lasted 3 days with conferences and teaching during the day and preaching during the evening. Missionaries from around the world were invited to attend and tell the women about their lives in foreign countries. This time gave the women from around the state the time to make friends that lasted their lifetime.

The WMS groups did everything they could to earn money to send to the national headquarters to support the mission-aries. "Penny a Day" started during the depression to help the desperate needs. The Linen Chest was started to supply needs for Missionaries and furloughed missionaries. Nora Hunter crocheted an afghan for every woman who went on the mission field while she was traveling from place to place. A copy of those handwritten minutes were still available to the state secretary (Mrs. A.B Mizell did the minutes.) in years past. Meetings were also held during the summer Camp-meetings, and a fall Prayer Retreat. The name changed to Women of the Church of God in the '90's and Christian Women Connection in 2009. and the CWC groups continue the work of supporting missions that was started so many years ago.
